Although it is said that both your anchors need to be 15 ft apart, the decision is a bit vague. Because there are various sorts and sizes of hammocks in the market. And all of them require various distances for their anchors. So sit back, relax and allow us to explain it to you.

Distance/Space Between Trees For Hammock

While you are hanging a hammock starting with one tree then onto the next, it ought to matter the size of the hammock first. Clearly, you ought to pick a decent size tree that can hold the weight. In any case, how wide would it be advisable for them to be apart?

Hammock specialists say that assuming you are using a tree to hang your hammock from, the distance between ought to be at 80% of the length of your hammock. As the hammock will stretch and come to its full form after you have installed it, it is wise to keep the distance nearer.

This way, your hammock won't touch the ground after you lay on it. More often than not the distance is measured in a general number without keeping the length of the hammock in mind. This allows the hammock to sag with one sitting and you wind up tightening your hammock.

So going with the length of the hammock is the key.

How High To Hang A Hammock From Two Ground Posts?

On the off chance that you are going to hang your hammock from two ground stands, measure the length of your hammock and keep the 80% guideline again.

You benefit from your hammock depending on how it is hung. And the strength of the posts is crucial. It ought to be gotten with concrete from the underground. A basic installation under the dirt won't count.

Make sure you dig an opening that keeps 33% of the post underground. And concrete it for greater security.

And then you can hang your hammock from your posts with eye bolt screws or straps.

How Long Is A Hammock?

Generally, a normal hammock goes from 6-12 ft. This number can change depending on the size you want.

You ought to always leave a space surrounding your hammock. As it has a floating sort of design, it is inclined to accidents and injuries. So the distance between your posts and the space around them ought to be liberated from any obstacles.

This way, regardless of whether you accidentally fall or a strap somehow falls off, you won't hurt yourself badly.

The Ideal Range Starting from the earliest stage A Hammock

The ideal level for hanging a hammock is 2-3 ft above the ground. More than that will make your hammock sag more underneath.

And getting off and getting in will be troublesome. Needless to say about the injuries you could sustain.
