### 1. Thread Counts

Thread counts indicate the deployment of the number of fibers to make a bedsheet. While a higher number of thread counts usually implies a better level of comfort, it is not always the case. Thread counts can range from 200 to 500 to 1000. While 800 Thread Count Sheets and 1000 Thread Count Sheets are often taken to provide best-in-class comfort, what matters a lot is the finish that comes with the number of thread counts. Shop for a higher thread count bedsheet with premium finishing to ensure that not only do you get comfort but the comfort that lasts.

## 2. Material Used

Threads are one thing but what type of threads are we talking about here? While cotton bedsheets are known to provide higher comfort, they can be a little cumbersome to deal with. Polyester on the other hand is known for easy handling but presents itself with a compromise on the level of comfort. Hence choose a fabric that suits your need and purpose and decide accordingly.

### 3. The Fit You Need

Imagine investing time and money in a bedsheet that does not fit the bed after you bring it home. We can feel your pain. That is why measuring the mattress is essential as you go on buying a bed sheet. While polyester bedsheets offer greater flexibility in fitting what they trade off with is thickness. The staple length refers to the length of fiber used to weave your sheet. Longer staple length to the north of 2 inches is considered to be of higher quality as they enhance both comfort and durability of your bedsheet and gets you a sleep you would love to miss your alarm to.
